Audience members take the biology test alongside with the main character of the play - Morgan. A pre- and post test will help to measure the mastery of the subject matter.

The play begins with Morgan having more of a desire for dancing and Hip Hop music than paying attention in class.

At the conclusion of the play, students are invited to perform an actual dissection of a pig's heart.

This anatomical lab helps to reinforce the material that was presented during the play.

Lunch is served in a small group setting with health care professionals followed by a closing ceremony where certificates of completion are distributed.
